At a Recreation and Welfare Committee Meeting hosted at the Council Chamber, Vauxhall Buildings, Vauxhall, Llanelli and via remote attendance on Tuesday, 17 December, 2024, at 4.45 p.m.

4. Provision of Grit Bins in council parks – matter requested for inclusion on the agenda by Cllr. A. Evans.

5. Llwynhendy Hub – to consider the Community Development Officers email on the community's response for recommendations for a new name for the former library building in Llwynhendy and to agree the council's response.

It was agreed to re-name the building - 'Canolfan Llwynhendy'.

6. Phil Bennett Resource Centre – Hot Water System – to consider correspondence from the Secretary, Felinfoel RFC requesting the council to review the provision of the hot water system at the changing rooms and to agree the council's response.

It was agreed to obtain a cost estimate for remedial work for inclusion in next year's budget estimates by commissioning an engineer's report to help identify an efficient and effective solution to reconfigure the hot and cold water system servicing the changing room showering facilities on the ground floor of the building and also to replace the heating boiler servicing the remainder of the building.

7. Bus Shelter – Sandy Road – further to Minute No. 184, to consider email correspondence from Carmarthenshire County Council regarding the proposed bus shelter at Sandy Road and to agree the council's response.

The proposal was supported in principle on the basis that Carmarthenshire County Council met the installation cost of the bus shelter when funding became available and also presented detailed drawings of the preferred design to the council for further consideration.
